

Municipal and School Board Election 2018

The next regular Municipal Election to elect a Mayor, Councillors and School Board Trustees will be held on Monday, October 22, 2018. The next term of Council begins on December 1, 2018 and concludes in 2022.

Bill 181, The Municipal Elections Modernization Act, 2016 came into effect June 9, 2016 and makes changes to the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 for the 2018 municipal election. Nomination Period

The nomination period will commence on Tuesday, May 1, 2018 and closes on Nomination Day, Friday, July 27, 2018.

To run for office, you must be an eligible elector in the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards. This means that you must be:

- A Canadian Citizen;
- At least 18 years of age;
- Reside in the Township, or be the owner or tenant of land in the Township, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- Not prohibited from voting under any law.

Alternative Voting - 2018 Municipal Election

On November 21, 2017, Council passed By-Law #52-2017, to approve the use of Vote by Mail for the 2018 Municipal Election. By-Law #52-2017 can be accessed [here](#).

Vote by Mail Kits will be mailed out to eligible electors during the week of September 17, 2018. Electors may return their ballot and required declaration either by return mail, by bringing it in to the Municipal Office during regular office hours until 4:30 PM on October 19, 2018, or by bringing it to the Ballot Return Station (Medical Centre), on October 22, 2018 between the hours of 10:00 AM and 8:00 PM.

Are you on the Voters' List?

The Voters' List for the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards is prepared by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC). MPAC is a not-for-profit corporation mandated by the Government of Ontario to conduct property assessments for tax purposes on behalf of municipalities, and is legislated to provide municipalities with a Preliminary List of Electors in a municipal election year. This list is used by Municipal Clerks to produce the final Voters' List used for the election.

MPAC administers voterlookup.ca which is an online service available to electors. Using voterlookup.ca, electors can confirm and update their electoral information for the purposes of the Preliminary List of Electors for the upcoming municipal and school board elections. MPAC will launch Voterlookup.ca during the spring of 2018.
