Killaloe businesses launch Pocket Market this year

Over the winter, some discussion has been happening with businesses in the Killaloe part of the municipality about how we could attract more interest into Killaloe. The idea that emerged from that discussion was to create a "Pocket Market:" a market for creative vendors. The Market would be located at the Information Centre site.

Pocket Markets are often found in other 'artsy' regions and these street vendors become an integral part of the community and bring activity

and social scene to a public space. The Market vendors are artists and crafters, which are popular in our region and neighbouring communities.

The Killaloe Pocket Market will celebrate the character of Killaloe and offer our local artists, creators and vendors the opportunity to share their products such as vintage items, artwork, artifacts and other creative curiosities with our community and tourists. The goal is to create a commerce environment, run by existing business owners, for like-minded

artists. People can shop, interact, engage and explore and vendors will be encouraged to share their visions, stories and new ideas.

Flood Information For Residents

Just in case snow melts fast, here is what you should know

The municipality is advising residents where they can pick up sand and sandbags if needed during the spring freshet.

The winter of 2013-14 has been long with snow staying from November to the present day. With the oncoming warmer spring temperatures the snow and ice melt will begin. The Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards will be

supplying sand and sand bags to those persons needing them.

Three control sites are being set up for members of the public to obtain sandbags and sand.

1. The Municipal Office at 1 John Street in Killaloe.
2. The Round Lake Fire Hall at 2995 Round Lake Road in Round Lake Centre.
3. The Township works yard at 16370 Highway 60 (west of

Simpson Pit Road.)

Sites with sand only include:
1. Across the road from 1433 Red Rock Road.

2. Across the road from 580 Red Rock Road.

All inquiries are to be directed to the municipal office at 613-757-2300 from Monday to Friday and between the hours of 8:30am and 4:30pm.

The website is an online service used to build and maintain information that will be used in the preparation of the final voters' lists across Ontario.

Residents can also change or update their school support for electoral purposes and add names to their property address. Accessing www.voterlookup.ca is easy! To confirm your information is accurately recorded for the upcoming elections, you need to supply:

1. Your name and date of birth.
2. Your town or city, property address or assessment roll

number, included on your latest Property Assessment Notice.

Using www.voterlookup.ca you can confirm your elector eligibility or update your electoral information.

First Responders Get Their Day

The Province of Ontario has passed a Bill declaring May 1 as First Responder's Day.

First responders are those men and women who, in the early stages of an emergency, are responsible for the protection and preservation of life, property, evidence and the environment. They include police officers, firefighters, military personnel, paramedics, medical evacuation pilots, dispatchers, nurses, doctors, emergency medical technicians and emergency managers.

First responders are volunteers and professionals who have dedicated their lives to public service. Their life-saving skills often make the difference between life and death. Their public service deserves to be recognized and honoured. The Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards is grateful to the many men and women who keep us safe.

Proper Care Key to Good Septic System

What to do to make sure your system functions well

Proper operation and the maintenance of the septic system can have a significant impact on how well it works and how long it lasts.

Maintenance for your septic system can be compared to maintenance that you perform with your vehicle - only a little effort on a regular basis can save money and significantly prolong the life of both.

For those of you who can use some tips on maintaining a well-functioning septic system, here are some important tips:

Routine Pumping

Maintain a routine pumping schedule. The frequency for which your tank needs to be pumped depends on the tank size, the number of people living in your home, and the habits of your particular household. The normal frequency to have the tank pumped is every three to



five years. The use of garbage disposals will also increase the need for more frequent pumping.

What You Flush

Be mindful of what you flush down the toilet. Flush only toilet tissue and wastewater. No paper towels, sanitary supplies, cigarette butts, kitty litter, dental floss or similar items.

The Leaching Bed

Protecting the leaching bed can add to the functioning of your system. Keep a short grass cover over the area and refrain from

driving over it or parking vehicles on it. You should also divert roof drains away from it. It is also important not to plant trees over or near the leaching bed.

Water Use

Use water wisely. Avoid doing a lot of laundry on one day, and immediately repair leaking faucets and toilets. You can also replace any older toilets that use more water. All of these things can ensure the septic functions in a balanced way.

Keep Records

As with many household responsibilities, keep detailed records of repairs, pumping inspections, and other maintenance activities. Those records could come in handy if something arises pertaining to your septic system.
