Report Crime

You can now use citizen self-reporting

Citizen self-reporting is a new service introduced by the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) that allows individuals to report crime from a computer or mobile device without going to an OPP detachment. All reports will be reviewed by an officer, and the individual may be contacted to provide more information. Individuals must have a valid e-mail address to submit a report.

The following occurrences can be reported online:

- 1) Lost/missing property under \$5,000
- 2) Stolen license plates or validation stickers
- 3) Theft from a vehicle under \$5,000
- 4) Mischief/damage to a vehicle under \$5,000
- 5) Mischief/damage to property (not vehicle) under \$5,000
- 6) Theft under \$5,000
- 7) Driving complaint

If the occurrence does not qualify for online reporting, call the OPP at 1-888-310-1122 or visit your local detachment.

Fire Department Open House

A fun, informative stop on July 18th



In keeping with the tradition of being an integral part of the community, the KHR Fire Department is again hosting their annual Open House.

The Fire Department Open House will take place on Saturday, July 18 from 10:00am to 2:00pm. There will be a demonstration of kitchen fires and an opportunity for the public to be involved in fire safety. Use an actual fire extinguisher and extinguish a controlled fire, and try your hand at a fire hose to see how much control they (and

you) have with it.

Of course, there will be activities for the kids such as the fire streams target board and mini fire truck rides. Exhibits will include the municipal fire fleet, the famous antique Bickle Fire Pump and the Evacuation Centre set-up and display. Fire equipment displays will include the department's extrication equipment, and a local fire museum. There will also be educational items such as DVDs on fire safety and the fire prevention smoke house. For

those needing smoke detectors or carbon monoxide detectors for home or cottages, there will be some available for sale.

An Open House is not complete without some great food and the department will be cooking up hotdogs on the BBQ and providing cold drinks free of charge.
