KHR Joins Wisdom Campaign

One of 250 rural municipalities in Canada to be selected

KHR has been chosen as one of 250 rural communities in Canada to be part of the Open Water Wisdom Campaign for 2013. The campaign encourages youth and parents of youth to use life jackets for safety throughout the summer.

The purpose of the national campaign is to recognize that Canada's waterways are like highways and playgrounds in that they are used for traveling and for enjoyment of the

outdoors. This is plenty evident in Killaloe, Hagarty, Richards with both residents and visitors enjoying the water-based opportunities in the region. Water also provides youth with opportunities for sport and recreation.

The Township's role is to open the door to awareness about safe practices and behavior in order to help protect children and youth from harm around water. The municipality has received

30 life jackets that can be signed out for use at no charge by youth in the municipality. These life jackets will be available to borrow from the Visitor Information Centre to any member of the community from June 29 to Labour Day weekend.

An Open House will be held on Saturday, June 29 at the Round Lake Recreation Centre from 10:00am to Noon. The public is more than welcome to attend.

Federal Gas Tax Supports KHR

Canada's Gas Tax Fund provides long-term funding for municipalities to support municipal infrastructure projects in the following categories: drinking water, wastewater infrastructure, public transit, community energy systems, solid waste management and local roads.

The Township of Killaloe,

Hagarty and Richards spent \$94,977.29 in 2012 on the double surface chips on 1.3 km of Red Rock Road, and road rehabilitation on a section of Hillcrest Avenue and Mask Road. This year, there will be work on sidewalks in Killaloe, chips on a section of Water Street in Killaloe and Turners Road in Bonnechere, cold mix

on two sections of Mask Road, hot mix and double surface chips on another section of Red Rock Road and surface treatment to sections of Deer Trail Road and Mountain View Road. The cost is \$190,000 with 100% covered by the federal gas tax. Note that care is always taken to make sure projects are spread throughout the township.

SWIM PROGRAM

Registration for the swim program is Friday, June 28th at the township office. The cost is \$40 per child. The program is appropriate for children ages three and older. The swim program is a partnership with Bonnechere Provincial Park where the lessons take place. It runs July 2 - August 9. Attendance is not mandatory at each lesson in order to complete a level. Township Joins National Parks and Recreation Month Promo

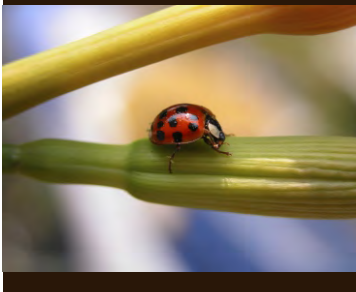


The Township is joining schools, organizations and municipalities across the province to declare the month of June to be Recreation and Parks Month! More information is available online at: recandparksmonth.ca.

Fire Department Report For April-May

Training and fire calls continue to keep department busy

The Township Fire Department noted some interesting figures in their report to Council on May 21. Firefighters have been busy with a variety of services and training. Highlights include:

Fire Calls

There have been six fire calls since the last report to Council. Calls were for a chimney fire,

grass fires and a visible smoke notice, which ended up not being in the municipal boundaries

Firefighter Training

The department participated in a road tour for Madawaska Valley. A firefighter was hired, bringing the total to 22 active firefighters, and the annual ladder certification is underway.

Recent training includes: fire prevention officer training (3 firefighters trained), CPR training for 20 firefighters, hose lays and pump set-up training for 18 firefighters, legislation training in Petawawa for one firefighter and breathing apparatus training for 15 firefighters.

Future Training

Future training for the department will include drafting, flagging, WHMIS, DZ licencing and portable fire extinguisher training.

Open Air Burning Reminders

Things to note during the fire season: April 1 to October 31

1. The material to be burned is limited to clean wood, clean wood wastes, grass and wood by-products.
2. Brush piles for burning must be no larger than 2m diameter, 2m high and not less than 10 meters apart. Maximum of 3 brush piles burning at any time.
3. For burning grass, the areas to be burned shall be less than one acre and the length of the flaming edge shall be less than

- 30 meters.
4. The person conducting the burning must ensure that the means of extinguishing the fire is available on site at all times.
5. The fire may only be ignited two hours before sunset (or later) and is must be extinguished two hours after sunrise (or earlier).
6. No burning shall be allowed within the Village of Killaloe.
7. All persons setting an open-air fire in the township shall be

responsible for any damage to property or injury to persons and be held liable for costs incurred.

8. No open-air fire is permitted when the wind is a factor in unsafe conditions.

Any person contravening any provision of the by-law is guilty of an offence and liable to a fine, and all costs incurred by the Township for the extinguishing the fire.

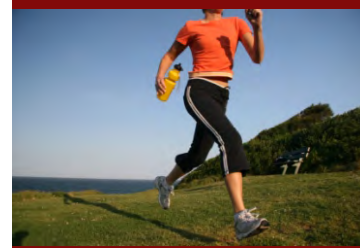
Tender for Replacement of Heating System

Planning to Build a Deck This Summer?

Building permits are often necessary

Planning on building a deck? If so, you may be wondering if you need a permit. The answer is "yes." In most cases, a permit will be required.

How To Get A Permit

A permit can be obtained by going to the Township website at www.khrtownship.ca, or by attending the municipal office at 1 John Street in Killaloe. Township hours are 8:30am to 4:30pm, Monday to Friday.

Requirements

You need to complete an Application for Construction. You will be required to submit plans that may include any or all of the following: site plan, cross section and deck floor plan.

For the site plan, you will need to indicate distance from the deck to the property line, and to any existing buildings on site. If your property has a water and/or septic system, you need to

indicate their locations and distances from the deck.

The deck floor plan will need to indicate the deck size (length, width and height). You must provide a deck layout, indicating the joist direction on the plan as well as size, spacing of joists and span between joist supports. You need to list all the materials to be used (joist hangers, nails, screws, etc.) and you need to show the size, location and height of the columns. Specify your beam size and provide details of any stairs (if any.)

Guardrail Protection

Open sides of a deck must be protected by a guardrail for the length where there is an elevation of more than 600mm (24 inches) between the deck and the ground. For a deck that is more than 600mm (24 inches) and less than 1800mm (5 feet, 11 inches) above the finished

ground level, you will require a guard no less than 900mm (3 feet) from the deck surface. For decks more than 1800mm (5 feet, 11 inches), you require a guardrail of not less than 1070mm (42 inches) high from the deck surface.

Openings in guardrails in a non-industrial building shall be small enough that a spherical object with a diameter of 100mm (4 inches) will not fit through.

Guardrails shall be designed so no part, including ornamental fixtures, will facilitate climbing. A railing is required on one side of the exterior stairs numbering three stairs or more.

Finally, floor joists must be a minimum dimension of 2 inches x 8 inches or 38mm x 184mm.
