Plan Volunteer to get involved.

If you would like to be called to help during an emergency please contact the township office now, before an emergency arises, so you are ready to help if an event arises.

The priority of volunteer activity during an emergency is assisting others. This spontaneous activity must be well

managed to have a positive affect, and contribute to the healing process of individuals and the community.

Signing up as an Emergency Plan Volunteer ahead of time means organizers can track and manage volunteers effectively and volunteer services can be directed where they can best be utilized.

## Students Starting Businesses

If you're between the ages of 15 and 29, and are returning to school in the Fall, you might wish to test your entrepreneurial abilities as part of the Summer Company program.

Locally, this program is offered by Enterprise Renfrew County. Summer Company offers mentorship, training and awards of up to \$3,000. Students can apply online until May 6, 2016.

This program is financially supported by the Government of Ontario and has been in operation since 2001. High school students enrolled in the Specialized High Skills Major (SHSM) program can earn up to two co-op education credits while participating in the Summer Company program. # National Day of Mourning April 28th at 7:00pm at Shrine Hill, Wilno

April 28th is observed across Canada as the National Day of Mourning, a day to honour those who have died, suffered injury or experienced illness due to work-related causes.

## Why April 28th?

On that day in 1914, the Workmen's Compensation Act was given third reading in the Ontario Legislature. It was made official in Canada by an Act of Parliament. In 1984, April 28th was established as a Day of Mourning by the Canadian

Labour Congress. This was a day to mourn for the dead and fight for the living. In 1991 the Canadian federal government passed legislation making April 28th as the National Day of Mourning for persons killed, injured or suffered illness in the workplace. This has since become an International movement.

The International Labour Organization celebrates the World Day of Safety and Health at work on April 28th to promote

the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally.

Recognition of this event arrived in Renfrew County in 2000 with the establishment of a monument in Pembroke, followed in 2001 by the placement of a memorial in the town of Renfrew. Then a few local people in the town of Wilno erected a monument in 2004 on Shrine Hill. On April 28th, a Day of Mourning event will be held at 7:00pm at the Shrine Hill monument.

## Emergency Preparedness Week May 1-7 Preparation is everyone's responsibility

When it comes to being prepared for an emergency, we all have a role to play.

You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours during an emergency. Know the basic principles of first aid and have basic supplies available

(food, batteries, flashlight.)

By definition, emergencies happen when we don't expect them, and often when families are not together. Suddenly, you need to think about your kids at school or elderly parents across town. If phones don't work, or some streets aren't accessible,

what will you do?

- Wet wipes of all types

- Facial tissue
- Paper hand towels
- Tampons, applicators, and pads
- Condoms
- Bandages
- Disposable toilet brush heads
- Cigarette butts
- Kitty litter
- Unwanted medication
- Paint

### Protect Your Septic

Your toilet may seem like a convenient way to get rid of certain unwanted items because you simply flush it and they

disappear. However, toilets are only intended to get rid of human body waste and toilet paper. Everything else you might be tempted to flush should usually be bagged and disposed of with your regular garbage. Use the garbage for items that should not be flushed and enjoy a longer lasting septic system. You can save yourself a lot of expense and inconvenience by ensuring that you take care of your septic from inside the house, as well as outside.
