# **FLOOD PREPARATION:**

## A Message from Mayor Janice Visneskie Moore; Update on request for amendment to BRWMP

Further to a conference call on February 15, 2019 that I participated in with MNRF Minister John Yakabuski and members of his staff, Shawn Cameron from RPG and Rob Norris from the SAC Committee, I am pleased to provide you with the following update:

Minister Yakabuski has advised that, under his leadership, the request for amendments to the BRWMP will be addressed. At this point we don't know whether the ministry will approve the amendments as presented, but we feel that this meeting is a step forward in the process. That being said, we recognize that the amendments are a short-term solution, but they would provide a positive first step in a long-term solution to the ongoing flooding is-

sue. Minister Yakabuski has also advised that public consultation will be held regarding amendments to the BRWMP, and we will keep stakeholders and the public apprised of any further information that we receive in this regard. At the meeting, MNRF gave their anticipated timeline for seeking approval for the amendment to the WMP as fall of 2019. We appreciate the efforts of all involved in this process, especially Minister Yakabuski, Shawn Cameron and RPG, and the members of the SAC Committee, and we look forward to providing you with additional information as it becomes available. Thank you for your patience and cooperation in regard to this very important matter.

## A message from CEMC (Community Emergency Management Coordinator) Bob Gareau

Floods are unpredictable and destructive. Flooding can happen anywhere, at any time and from a variety of water sources including rivers, creeks, overflowing catchments and due to heavy rainfall. In preparation for the possibility of spring flooding again this year, Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards (KHR) Township has made some arrangements to try and mitigate the effects of the flood and assist in the response.

- Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards will identify and post the locations on our municipal website where sand and sandbags will be available.
- Although property owners are responsible for any preparations in mitigating the flood effects, some assistance in filling or placing sandbags may be available from some very helpful, community-minded high school students. Contact the Community Emergency Management Coordinator (CEMC) through the municipal office at 613-757-2300 to arrange for assistance
- The Red Cross is available to assist individuals that need to be temporarily relocated and may also be able to supply clean-up kits for interior cleanup of residences.
   For assistance please contact the Red Cross directly at 1-866-637-4263.
- The Renfrew County and District Health Unit (RCDHU) will be available to provide drinking water testing and provide information on septic system maintenance and well water care before and after a flood as well as on the effects of mould contamination and other medical concerns.

- Please contact David Tantalo (Manager of Healthy Environments) directly at 613-735-8654 x 569 for information.
- The Department of National Defence (DND), specifically the military from Base Petawawa has been contacted and subject to the services requested and the availability of personnel, they may be able to provide assistance.

Should flooding be forecasted, you may wish to reference a newly created document titled "Flood Preparations, and Response During a Flood" available on the township's website at www.killa-loe-hagarty-richards.ca or available in hard copy at the municipal office. It covers such topics as: Housing Preparations, Caring for Farm Animals, what to include in an Evacuation Kit, Evacuation Preparation, how to properly construct a sandbag dam or wall and General Precautions to take during a flood.

Another document available is the "Renfrew County Flood Impact and Recovery" document also available on the township's website at www.killaloe-hagarty-richards.ca or available in hard copy at the municipal office. It covers such subjects as Returning to Homes and Properties, Safety and Health, Interior Cleanup, Exterior Cleanup, Septic System information, Private Well information amongst others.

**VOLUNTEERS NEEDED-** If you are able to provide assistance during a flood and wish to volunteer, please contact the Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards Municipal Office at 613-757-2300 and request to be put on the volunteer contact list. During any emergency, volunteers are critically needed in a variety of roles.

# **National Day of Mourning**

# April 28 at 7:00pm at Shrine Hill, Wilno

April 28 is observed across Canada as the National Day of Mourning, a day to honour those who have died, suffered injury or experienced illness due to work-related causes.

On that day in 1914, the Workmen's Compensation Act was given third reading in the Ontario Legislature. It was made official in Canada by an act of Parliament. In 1984, April 28 was established as a Day of Mourning by the Canadian Labour Congress. This was a day to mourn for the dead and fight for the living. In 1991 the Canadian federal government passed legislation making April 28 as the National Day of Mourning for persons killed, injured or suffered illness in the workplace. This has since become an International movement.

The International Labour Organization celebrates the World Day of Safety and Health at work on April 28 to promote the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally. Recognition of this event arrived in Renfrew County in 2000 with the establishment of a monument in Pembroke, followed in 2001 by the placement of a memorial in the town of Renfrew. Then a few local people in the town of Wilno erected a monument in 2004 on Shrine Hill. On April 28, a Day of Mourning event will be held at 7:00pm at the Shrine Hill monument.
