Native Culture Is Nearby

Trading Post owner has long history with Pikwakanagan

Interested in Aboriginal culture? Then head to the Algonquin Trading Post in Deacon, at the head of Golden Lake.

Owner Aimee Bailey, the granddaughter of the Algonquins of Pikwàkanagàn's famous canoe builder, Matt Bernard, opened the cultural gift shop in 2002, and has showcased both local and national aboriginal arts and crafts to thousands of tourists from around the world.

With the help of her husband, retired machinist and history buff Doug Fischer, the couple designed the building to resemble the Trading Posts of northern British Columbia; they then had a local contractor complete the project using red and white pine lumber from the area. Their website, www.algonquintradingpost.com, says that



their goal is to “build a bridge between cultures.” They do this by offering education to public about Aboriginal culture, philosophy, and history. The Trading Post carries a good selection of books on these

topics, and the items in their shop include their cultural context, whenever possible.

While both Aimee and Doug are artists themselves and do make some items for their store, they also offer fine quality art pieces from local artisans and procure other pieces from across Canada. Occasionally, items from the United States and Mexico are available when they fit with their Trading Post theme.

The Trading Post in Deacon opens in May and has regular hours of 10:00am to 5:00pm from Wednesday to Sunday, until Thanksgiving. In the off-season, you can order online or call to make an appointment to visit the store by calling 613-625-9977.

Community Emergency Management

Prepare your own emergency survival pack

Every municipality is mandated by the Province of Ontario to prepare an emergency response plan for their community. The Emergency Preparedness Committee for Killaloe-Hagarty-Richards works diligently each year to maintain our compliance with provincial regulations. The committee is interested in recruiting volunteers to sit on this committee to help should the need arise to declare a "state of emergency" in the municipality.

One important aspect of the plan is public education for the community. The Province is encouraging municipalities to ensure that the public is aware that they have a responsibility for taking care of their basic needs of protecting life and property during the first 72 hours of an emergency.

Be Prepared

The municipality continues to promote the importance of emergency preparedness for all through our community and ministry emergency management and business continuity coordinators.

Emergency Survival Checklist

Note: your checklist should include a three day supply per person in your family.

- Food (non-perishable)
- Manual can opener
- Bottled water (4L/person/day)
- Medication(s)
- Flashlight
- Radio (crank or battery-run)
- Extra batteries
- First-aid kit
- Candles and matches/lighter
- Hand sanitizer or towelettes
- Important papers (id, etc.)

- Extra car keys and cash
- Whistle (to attract attention)
- Zip-lock bags
- Garbage bags
- Items for babies/children/pets
- Clothes and shoes
- Sleeping bags/blankets
- Personal items (soap, etc.)
- Playing cards and travel games

Tips

Pack the contents of your kit in an easy-to-carry bag like a backpack and store it in a place that is easy to access. Check and refresh your kit twice a year. Add to your kit throughout the year. Ensure your cell phone and mobile devices are always charged.
