January is Crime Stoppers Month

January is Crime Stoppers month and in Renfrew County, the organization plays a large role in helping solve crime. The Pembroke/Renfrew County program established in 1989. Tips have resulted in 578 arrests, 1,146 cases cleared, \$73,325 in rewards paid out, \$958,658 property recovered, and \$12,329,384 drugs seized.

The local detachment is one of 105 Crime Stoppers

organizations in Canada, and one of 600 in the world. Crime Stoppers is founded on the belief that for every crime committed someone other than the criminal has information that could help solve the crime. Crime Stoppers promises anonymity when providing information that could help the police prevent or solve a crime. When you call in, your information is sent to an investigative unit that reports

back to Crime Stoppers if your tip was helpful in preventing or solving a crime. Helpful tips could earn a cash reward of up to \$2000 and you do not have to attend in court. You can call 1-800-222-8477 or visit www.valleytips.ca and register your tips online.

Watch for Holiday RIDE Program

Be part of a safe community this holiday season

The Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) will be conducting its annual Festive R.I.D.E. (Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere) campaign to reduce driving impaired over the holidays and is requesting the public's assistance in removing impaired drivers from the roads.

The campaign will commence at on Monday, November 24th and until Friday, January 2nd, 2015.

The OPP knows the vast majority of drivers do

understand that enforcement is only part of the solution and that driving sober is the single most important factor in ending the numerous impaired driving related deaths that occur on Ontario roads every year. The OPP considers these drivers to be among their most dedicated road safety partners because they share the responsibility of saving lives on our roads through responsible driving behaviour.

The OPP is also reminding drivers that there is no safe

amount of alcohol consumption when driving. This is evident every year in the number of Warn Range Suspensions the OPP issues to drivers whose Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) falls within the 0.05 to 0.08 range.

Those who are issued a Warn Range Suspension immediately lose their licence at the roadside and are not allowed to drive from that point on for a minimum of three days.

Drive Safe, Drive Sober.

Bonnechere Park Season Update Book Tree, Library Passes Prove Popular

Bonnechere Provincial Park had two initiatives for local residents this year that enjoyed great feedback. First was a free day pass available through the Killaloe Public Library. The second, was the installation of a Book Tree in the Park.

A season's pass was provided to the library to be loaned out to those in the municipality. The pass could be loaned out for up to three days consecutively. It is pleasing to report that the pass was well used and well-received by residents. There were only a few days during the season that the pass was not leant out. Over the winter, the partners will review the pilot and determine the best course of action for the future.

In August, the municipality and Park celebrated the sixth installment of a Book Tree in Renfrew County.

Book Trees originated in Germany in 2006 when a group from various industries created a wooden bookshelf using fallen trees. The idea is to take a book you like and leave one behind.

In 2011, the idea was presented locally by Karen Woods. The concept received \$25,000 in provincial funding and a Book Tree network was established in Renfrew County.

The Bonnechere Park Book Tree has several unique features:

About The Tree

The tree is a 100-year-old white pine that came down in an wind storm in 2012. A saw blade

around the base represents our region's logging history.

Position of Book Boxes

The book boxes are designed in a spiral fashion, symbolic of a progression in levels of reading.

Donations

Books have been donated by Friends of Bonnechere Park, Value Village and campers.

Over the winter, Bonnechere Park be working on signage to interpret the Book Tree and Pointer Boat to be installed for 2015 peak season. Please celebrate this unique feature of the Park and the community.

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Homes to comply by April 15, 2015

Ontario is taking another step to keep families and homes in Ontario safe by making carbon monoxide alarms mandatory in all residential homes.

The new regulation, which came into effect October 15, 2014, updates Ontario's Fire Code following the passage of Bill 77 last year. These updates are based on recommendations

from a Technical Advisory Committee which was led by the Office of the Fire Marshal and Emergency Management and included experts from fire services, the hotel and rental housing industries, condo owners and alarm manufacturers.

A Carbon monoxide alarm will now be required near all sleeping

areas in residential homes and in the service rooms, and adjacent sleeping areas in multi-residential units. Carbon monoxide alarms can be hardwired, battery-operated or plugged into the wall. There is a six month implementation date for most residences (April 15, 2015).

Library Offering Training

Local residents can build Internet and computer skills

The Killaloe & District Public Library has a new educational service that provides area residents with free computer and Internet learning opportunities, as well as opportunities to learn how to use some of the latest technical devices such as I pads, tablets and smart phones.

Thanks to the Ontario Youth Internships Community Access Sites 2014-2015 Program, the Library hired Lisa Yutronkie to host these training sessions for business and personal use. The program begins in November and runs until March 2015. Appointments can be made for
