## **ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION TOUR!**

WHAT IS THE ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION TOUR?

The Environmental Action Tour is a community road clean up project that has been occurring annually since 2020. Hundreds of volunteers have come together over the years to help pick over 500 bags of garbage & recycling and hundreds of pounds of scrap metal from our roadways, ditches and fileds, cleaning up our community and the environment!

### HOW DOES IT WORK AND WHAT DO I NEED TO DO?

If you are interested in participating, all you need to do is register a team or ask to be added to a team by emailing or calling the contact provided. You will then be sent a registration form that you will need to fill out and return before the event. There is no cost to register and all materials will be provided to you before the event. If you have a road you would like to help clean up, you will be assigned that road and you can start picking any time on the day of the event.

Five prizes of \$200 each will be awarded for: Most Garbage, Weirdest Garbage, Best Team/Action Photo, Best Team Name and Most Valuable Picker! Each household will also get 10 free garbage tags for participating as well as a free souvenir t-shirt for each team member. There will also be a Meet and Greet event on April 28th where likeminded people can gather over a free meal and music the day before the event. On the day of the event, we will come around with water and extra supplies. Afterwards, KHR Public Works Department will pick up the bags from the side of the road.





Covered Bridge Park is a family-owned and operated seasonal campground run by the Sadecki family.

This beautiful destination has over 150 acres of waterfront campground on the Bonnechere River with cottages, cabins, tent and trailer sites. They also have recently acquired a yurt tent which is available for rent.

The park is located east of Algonquin Provincial Park in Tramore on the north side of Bonnechere River between Round Lake and Golden Lake.

The Sadecki family is made up of Andrew, Dzidka, and their 4 kids, Olek, Justina, Emilia and Julia. They are accompanied by their two loving, furry companions, Kubusz and Molly.
