International Firefighters' Day is observed on May 4th and has been every year since 1999 when it was first created.

The creation of International Firefighters' Day was implemented when the tragic deaths of 5 Australian Firefighters occurred while they were fighting a massive wildfire in 1999. It was then decided that May 4th would recognize the dedication and sacrifices that all firefighters execute everyday by putting their lives at risk to keep us all safe. May 4th is also dedicated to firefighters to create awareness and give us gratitude for all the brave firefighters we have throughout the world. According to the Ontario Association of Fire Chief's website, there are a total of 437 fire departments in Ontario including 32 Career Fire Departments, 210 Composite Fire Departments and 195 Volunteer Fire Departments. There are also 30,716 firefighters in Ontario including 18,281 Volunteer Firefighters, 11,971 Career Firefighters and 464 Part-Time Firefighters.



KHR Fire Department Messages

HOME FIRE PREVENTION PROGRAM

The goal of a home fire prevention program is to educate the residents on the precautions which should be taken to prevent potentially harmful fires and how to survive a fire if one does occur. Simple and inexpensive life-saving fire prevention strategies follow.

1. SMOKE ALARMS

Do you have smoke alarms installed on each floor of your home and outside of all sleeping areas? Also, have they been tested lately? These are necessary to ensure that sleeping persons can be woken up and gain precious extra minutes to vacate the premises should a fire condition exist.

2. CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR

If there are any open flame utilities in the house, such as a gas-fired stove or water heater, oil-fired furnace, a fireplace then a carbon monoxide detector is required. One is also required if there is an attached garage to the building. Do you have one? As per the Smoke Alarm, one is necessary to ensure that sleeping persons can be woken up and gain precious extra minutes to vacate the premises should a fire condition exist.

3. FIRE EXTINGUISHER

Fire extinguishers give the home owner a short period of time to extinguisher a fire if it located near where the fire is. The most common fire extinguisher type for home use is a Class A, B, and C. This type of fire extinguisher is used for the following type of fires:

Class A extinguishers will put out fires in ordinary combustibles such as wood and paper.

Class B extinguishers are for use on flammable liquids like gasoline and oil. Class C extinguishers are suitable for use only on electrically energized fires.

One of the major causes of home fires is kitchen fires. For this type of fire it is recommended that a Class K fire extinguisher be used.

Class K extinguishers are designed for use on cooking oils and fats in a commercial kitchen.

4. TWO WAYS OUT

Ensure that wherever a person is in the house that plans have been drawn up so that there are always two ways out. This may mean exiting through a second door, a window or via a fire escape ladder from the second floor.

These are but a few examples of a good Home Fire Prevention Program.

National Day of Mourning April 28

April 28 is observed across Canada as the National Day of Mourning, a day to honour those who have died, suffered injury or experienced illness due to work-related causes. **Why April 28?**

On that day in 1914, the Workmen's Compensation Act was given third reading in the Ontario Legislature. It was made official in Canada by an act of Parliament. In 1984, April 28 was established as a Day of Mourning by the Canadian Labour Congress. This was a day to mourn for the dead and fight for the living. In 1991 the Canadian federal government passed legislation making April 28 as the National Day of Mourning for persons killed, injured or suffered illness in the workplace. This has since become an International movement.

The International Labour Organization celebrates the World Day of Safety and Health at work on April 28 to promote the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally.

Recognition of this event arrived in Renfrew County in 2000 with the establishment of a monument in Pembroke, followed in 2001 by the placement of a memorial in the town of Renfrew. Then a few local people in the town of Wilno erected a monument in 2004 on Shrine Hill.

Emergency Preparedness Week May 5-11 Preparation is Everyone's Responsibility

When it comes to being prepared for an emergency, we all have a role to play. You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours during an emergency. Know the basic principles of first aid and have basic supplies available (food, batteries, flashlight.)

By definition, emergencies happen when we don't expect them, and often when families are not together. Suddenly, you need to think about your kids at school or elderly parents across town. If phones don't work, or some streets aren't accessible, what will you do?

Having a family emergency plan will save time and make real situations less stressful.

Sewage System Maintenance and Operation - A Homeowner's Guide

An On-Site Sewage System represents a significant investment for a homeowner. It is the responsibility of the homeowner to operate and maintain the system in accordance with the basis on which the use of the sewage system was approved for under the septic permit, the manufacturer's requirements and the regulations found under the Ontario Building Code.

Sewage Systems used in residential applications, specifically Class 4 leaching bed systems, are generally designed to only receive sanitary sewage and greywater. It is important that other items such as paint, unwanted medication, diapers, wet wipes, hygiene products, etc. NOT be deposited into your sewage system as this will result in the malfunction of the system. Even when operated correctly, Sewage Systems require regular care and maintenance. This includes regular inspection and cleaning of your septic tank's effluent filter, and pumping of the septic tank to remove sludge and solids. If you suspect your Sewage System may be reaching the end of its lifespan or may be malfunctioning, it is pertinent that you call a BCIN licensed On-Site Sewage System installer immediately to evaluate. All new installations of Sewage Systems, replacements and repairs require septic permits under the Ontario Building Code. If you require a permit or have further questions, please contact the Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards Building Department for further information.
