
Please note that on Monday July 1st, 2024, the Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards Township Office and Public Works Department will be closed for Canada Day.

GIANT OUTDOOR BOOK AND DVD SALE AUGUST 2, 2024





A brand new bike rally will bring a few hundred riders for a fund-raising rally with a sweet twist on July 28 in support of vision care in the

Ottawa Valley.

Tour de BeaverTails offers routes for riders of all abilities plus a heritage walk through town. Everyone who registers gets to celebrate, at the end, with a sweet treat. BeaverTails, which has become an international franchise corporation, was

"We thought combining a treat with healthy exercise would be a great way to encourage participation," says organizer Ish Theilheimer, a director of Ottawa Valley Cycling and Active Transportation Alliance (OVCATA). "We found willing partners in the Killaloe and Area Lions Club and, of course, the BeaverTail folks." Theilheimer has been friends with the founders since they started their food business at the Killaloe Craft and Community Fair.

The Lions Club was eager to partner with OVCATA on this, as they work on their Ottawa Valley Vision project.

One of the enthusiastic riders in the event will be Jeremy Steenberg, a blind athelete from BC who grew up in Killaloe. He works with the blind community to encourage participation in sports. "I try to encourage visually impaired people to get active. Forty percent of blind people don't go out at all," he says.

Everyone registering gets lunch and a BeaverTail after the ride, and riders get a commemorative T-shirt. The cost of registration is \$75 for adults and \$35 for youth (13-18) and walkers. To get a t-shirt, riders must register a month in advance.

Tick Prevention



PROTECT YOURSELF FROM BITES THIS SUMMER

According to Ontario Newsroom, the Provincial government has strongly encouraged residents to take preventative measures against tick bites, to minimize the risk of Lyme disease and other tick borne illnesses.

Lyme disease, transmitted through the bite of an infected black legged tick (deer tick), can lead to severe health issues. The Ministry of Health urges anyones who experinces symptoms to seek medical care if they think they have been bitten by a tick. Symptoms include fever, headache, chills, muscle and joint pain, fatigue, and a distinctive bullseye-shaped rash.

Deputy Premier and Minister of Health, Sylvia Jones, says by being proactive, we can reduce risks and still enjoy time outside.

Here are some helpful tips: -Light colored clothing makes ticks easier to spot;

-Tucking in all clothes including socks stops ticks from getting in;

-Use Repellent with DEET in it;

-Check your body for ticks when retuning inside, especially behind the knees and between toes;

-Put clothes worn outside in the dryer on high for 10 min before washing, to kill any ticks that may be on them.

If you do find a tick on you, do not crush it. Gently remove it with tweezers and sanitize the area with rubbing alcohol. Before disposing of it, look at the Public Heath Unit website to determine the type of tick, so you can get treated accordingly.
