Elections 2022

Monday October 24, 2022 is Election Day for Municipalities and School Board Trustees across the Province of Ontario. For the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards the following positions may be available to vote for depending upon the nomination papers that are filed on or before Nomination Day.

- Mayor (1 position)
- Councillor (6 positions)
- Renfrew County District School Board Public English Language Trustee (1 position)
- Renfrew County Catholic School Board Catholic English Language Trustee (1 position)

WHO CAN BE A CANDIDATE?

A candidate must be a resident of the municipality or a non-resident owner or tenant of land in the municipality or the spouse of such non-resident owner or tenant; a Canadian citizen and at least 18 years old; not legally prohibited from voting; and not disqualified by any legislation from hold-

ing municipal office.

You must pay a fee of \$100 for a Councillor and \$200 for Mayor.

An eligible candidate may file a nomination paper with the Clerk during regular office hours when the Clerks's office is open from Monday May 2, 2022 until Thursday August 18, 2022. On Nomination Day; Friday August 19, 2022, a nomination paper may be filed in the Clerk's office from 9:00 am until 2:00 pm. The onus is on the candidate to file a complete nomination paper with the correct fee. The fee for the position of Mayor is \$200.00 and the fee for Councillor is \$100.00 both payable in cash, certified cheque, money order or Interact. Certified cheques and/or money orders must be made payable to the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards.

WHO CAN VOTE IN ELECTIONS?

Anyone can vote in a municipal election who, on the day of the election, is:

- 18 years of age or older
- A Canadian citizen; and

- Either a resident of the municipality or a property owner or tenant or the spouse or same sex partner of an owner or tenant in the municipality during a specified time just before the election.

YOUR NAME MUST BE ON THE VOTERS' LIST IN ORDER TO CAST A BALLOT

If you are not on the voters' list, or if your information is incorrect, you may apply to have this information corrected. This may be done until the close of voting-on-voting day in a regular election or by-election and can be done at the voting place as well. You may be asked to show identification to establish that you are eligible to vote. For more information about getting on the voters' list, contact your municipal clerk.

Here we are. The event is over, the garbage is cleaned up and we can feel proud that thanks to the kindhearted efforts of local volunteers, we have made a difference! Mother nature and all her creatures can breathe and live a little easier, thanks to these wonderful people.

It's pretty inspiring when you think about it. On perfect sunny day, 79 people (over 300 total over the week) scaled steep banks and weathered deep ditches to help pick over 180 bags of garbage, recycling, and a various other scrap and hazardous

waste from our roadways. These people could have chosen to do anything else, but they chose to help the environment. For this we are extremely grateful.

Comparable in merit to these good deeds were the efforts of our two local elementary schools who took time out of their busy schedules to pitch in and clean up our community during the week. What a wonderful teaching opportunity for children to experience environmental activism and we are so grateful to the students, teachers and administrators for participating this

year!

Since 2020 we have picked over 400 backs of garbage out of the ditches. Year after year, over 80% of the items found in the ditches was recycling, which is free to drop off at our landfill and most landfills across Ontario.

The community response has been amazing, and together we have taken action! It's a massive statement and a powerful movement that continues to grow year after year and that is something we should all be extremely proud of!

In response to the increased demand and popularity of Ontario Parks, we introduced a new service in 2021 to help visitors secure their day use spot up to five days in advance of arrival in 17 provincial parks. Building on the success of last year's offering, visitors will be able to reserve day use permits at an additional 16 provincial parks

starting on May 16, 2022, for arrivals on May 20. This includes Bonnechere Provincial Park.
