We will share the results of the consultation process in early April and tell

you more about how your feedback will shape future planning for the Park.

Our motto for Killaloe Pathways Park is "we belong with nature." And everything that will happen in the park will be guided by the following principles:

- respect for the natural environment and ecology;
- collaborative processes of meaningful engagement with Algonquin peoples and local business, institutional and community interests;
- gratitude and acknowledgement of unceded ancestral territory of Algonquin peoples;
- respect and acknowledgement for the Hoch family homestead;

- respect and acknowledgement for past volunteers and community organizations; and
- benefit of the community at large and its citizens.

All development in the Park will be guided by our multi-partner consultation group, which includes both Killaloe schools, the Community Resource Centre, the Business in Action Group, the Seniors Active Living Centre, the Friends of the Killaloe Library and the Municipality, among others. 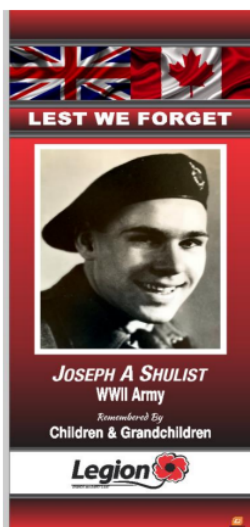

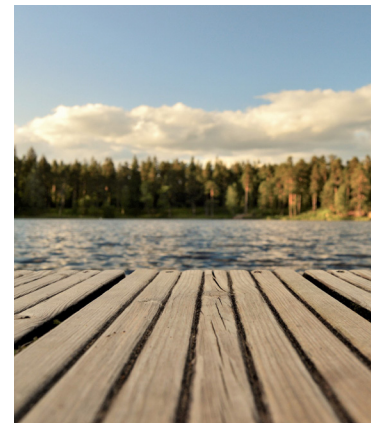
