### **Municipal Message**

The Ontario Government declared a provincial emergency and announced the implementation of a 4-week, provincewide stay-at-home order, effective Thursday, April 8, 2021 at 12:01 am.

This is in addition to the provincewide shutdown implementation of April 2, 2021.

plemented on April 3, 2021. Effective Monday April 12, 2021 the Municipal Office will be closed to the public. To limit the spread of COVID – 19, Municipal staff will be working remotely, however, departments can still be contacted by phone at 613-757-2300 during regular office hours of 8:30 am – 4:30 pm.

Residents are encouraged to make payments for water, sewage and property taxes online, at the bank, e-transfer, by mail via cheque/money order and/or drop off in the "Municipal Drop Box" located at the front entrance of the municipal building. When making an e-transfer payment email info@khrtownship.ca and be sure to include all necessary information such a name, account number(s), what the payment is for and password.

Waste sites will remain open and waste/recycle pick up will continue to operate with no disruptions. Tags for garbage can be purchased at the waste sites and/or dropped off in the "Municipal Drop Box" in an envelope with request, payment, name, address and phone number.

If you are using the drop box option, the tags will be mailed to the address provided.

The Killaloe and District Public Library will continue to offer curb side pick-up Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays between 11:00 am -4:00 pm and Thursdays between 11:00 am -6:00 pm.

## **Community Minded**

#### This Issue: Jackie Goodheart



Hailing all the way from Los Angles California, Jackie Goodheart might seem like she's a long ways from home but if you ask Jackie, Killaloe has been her home, away from home, for the past 30 years.

The name says it all, and anyone who knows her would agree that Jackie's good heart, strong spirit, peaceful disposition and passion for helping others make her seriously community minded, to say the least. How Jackie ended up in Killaloe is another story for another day and really does it matter? How anyone ends up in Killaloe is often quite a tale, but what really matters is what happens when they get here. In this small village in a small rural municipality, everybody has a different story as to how they got here, but they all share similar reasons for staying.

The same goes for Jackie. When talking about the local community, Jackie savs "There's something special about Killaloe, everyone has a sense of humour and they are all so good natured and down to Earth." She says that "in Killaloe, there's always room at the table and nobody slips through the cracks because there's always someone willing to help. It's the friendliest Village around and everyone is always smiling at each other because they know each other and help each other."

Helping others is right up Jackie's alley, and since she moved to Killaloe, she has been involved with a number of volunteer organizations including the Killaloe Friendship Club & the Killaloe Garden Club. She's also offered her expertise as a social worker to the Community Resource Centre, as well as various training groups in Psychosynthesis. In her earlier days, she led dance jams & women's circles at Half Moon Farm in Rockingham. More recently, she fulfilled the heartfelt dream of her late husband, George Linn, by creating Love's Healing Reading Room for the community.

When I asked Jackie what community means to her, she said "Community means connection. It also means accountability and friendship. When people give to the community, the community is healthier and thrives because everyone gets the help they need, when they need it, so people aren't over-burdened. When this happens, they are able to help others, and are inclined to pay it forward, bringing it full circle. But Jackie also suggests that if you're going to volunteer, make sure it works for you. If it's not fun, it's not worth doing and always remember you can say no!"

In closing, Jackie's had this message for the community: "Keep doing what you're doing! Volunteering doesn't need to always be structured. Here in the Village, there is a high level of giving that is not related to formal volunteer activities. so simple; it just means helping your neighbours and paying it forward. We live in a place where people are very self-sufficient but being self-sufficient doesn't always mean doing things on your own - often it means just being a good neighbour and being active in your community. Being a good neighbour is really the ultimate form of volunteerism!"
